## Achievements - Industry

- Industry Skills Report – Qld WFD requirements for the industry
- Brokerage – PPP/SIF(SIF) - \$600,000 over 2 years plus 30% industry input (PPP) - \$3.1m, 536,812 training hours, 1300 students, plus 20% dollar industry contribution
- Training package development
- Inaugural WFD conference 2012
- Advocate for Qld at national level – SSA Industry Advisory Committee



## Achievements - Industry

- Develop and implement Volunteer Portal
- Work with DETE on traineeships since 1995 – advice/advocacy/quality – over \$15m has been put into industry traineeships in that time
- Develop industry specific training – Club Central
- Brokerage special projects – JSDO – secured in excess of \$4m



## General achievements

- Coordinate industry responses to state/national policies
- Undertake regular industry surveys on WFD issues
- Facilitate SSA workshops
- Regional consultations – councils/TAFE/Govt departments
- Industry newsletters
- Project development –obtain external funding for
- WFD projects
- Monitor quality of RTOs in conjunction with DETE – school based traineeships



## General Achievements

- In conjunction with peak fitness, sport & rec bodies develop and implement strategic plans, annual reports
- Provide direct advice to parents/schools about careers in the industry
- Industry advice to grassroots clubs- governance, risk assessment, issues
- Redeveloped Skills Alliance website



## Environment

- Continued fiscal restraint by State government – possibly now also Federal – less funding available for organisations
- Less \$'s from all traditional avenues - e.g. Jupiters
- New challenges for Skills Alliance - exist for industry, membership base
